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Objective

The course objective is for the student to attain a foundational level of artistic and technical ability, musical leadership and musical communication within the specialization of choral conducting. This also includes the ability to implement independent artistic ideas within assigned time frames and to evaluate and reflect upon their work on an ongoing basis.

This course is a part of the Bachelor's Programme in Music, Conducting with a specialization in Choral Conducting (KKDK1).

Content

The course includes:

- conducting techniques, gestures and body language as well as rehearsal methodologies,
- musical leadership and group dynamics,



- musical interpretation and communication of musical expression,
- score analysis, interpretation of vocal texts and score study,
- repertoire and the history of conducting,
- transposition and score playing,
- ear training and structural listening.

Intended learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the student is expected to:

Knowledge and understanding

- demonstrate an overall knowledge of the choral repertoire and an understanding of its role and possibilities in different contexts,
- demonstrate a foundational knowledge of methods and processes within choral conducting,

Competence and skills

- demonstrate foundational skills in choral conducting, musical leadership and rehearsal methodologies,
- demonstrate a foundational ability to engage in independent score study, perform agreed-upon repertoire and communicate musical expression,
- demonstrate an ability, by ear, to generally describe and reproduce melodies, harmonies and rhythms, and be able to play simple choral scores on the piano,

Judgement and approach

- demonstrate a foundational ability to reflect critically upon their own artistic approach to tradition and performance practice,
- demonstrate a foundational ability to reflect critically on the artistic work of others,
- demonstrate a foundational knowledge of different aspects of gender equality in music.

Conducting: artistic performance and interpretation test,

Forum (seminar series about conducting): active participation as well as written presentation,

Ear training: practical presentation,

Score Playing: practical presentation.

Course demands

In order to obtain a final grade on the course, the grade “Pass” on all examination assignments as well as completed attendance of at least 80% regarding all teaching on the course is required.
