Objective

The course objective is for the student to develop a foundational knowledge of the requirements and capabilities of musical instruments as well as foundational skills in orchestration for different groups of instruments.

A knowledge of orchestration aids the student's understanding of the structure of a musical work and offers tools for musical study and interpretation.

This course is a part of the subject area of music theory in the Bachelor's Programme in Music, Conducting with a specialization in Choral Conducting (KKDK1) and the Bachelor's Programme in Music, Conducting with a specialization in Orchestral Conducting (KKDO1).

Content

The course deals with orchestration based on the classical repertoire. The course includes:

- foundational familiarity with compass, dynamics, transposing, timbre and expressive capabilities of the most common string, woodwind, brass and percussion instruments,
- notation for these instruments according to established practice,
- orchestration techniques, including doubling techniques, unison voicing, chord voicing and fore- and backgrounds,
- composition/orchestration for different ensembles.

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Intended learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the student is expected to:

Knowledge and understanding

- discuss the function, register and other characteristics of the instruments of the symphony orchestra,
- demonstrate familiarity with the articulation capabilities and special characters of the instruments,
- demonstrate familiarity with historical orchestration practice,
- demonstrate an understanding of the use of orchestration as an expressive tool in the music of different eras,

Competence and skills

• compose/orchestrate music for ensembles of 4-8 instruments in a genre of their choice,

Judgement and approach

- demonstrate an ability to make judgements about orchestration based on both artistic considerations and the practical capabilities of instruments,
- demonstrate an ability, as a conductor, to evaluate the orchestration of a musical work in terms of both technical level and artistic expression.
