Objective

The course objective is for the student to master, at a good level, the role of the instrumentalist in different ensemble constellations. This includes conceiving and realizing independent artistic ideas jointly with other ensemble members within assigned time frames, as well as developing the ensemble playing techniques and skills necessary to jointly perform specified works from the repertoire. A second course objective is for students to develop a good familiarity with historically informed performance practice, from the medieval period to classicism.

This course is a part of the Bachelor's Programme in Music, with a specialization in Early Music (KKKT1).

Content

The course includes:

- studying works by different composers arranged for different groups of instruments, with consideration given to the specific repertoire situation for individual instruments,
- different styles of historically informed performance practice, notation issues and ornamentation in specific areas of repertoire,
- repertoire planned so as to reflect a broad diversity of historical eras and genres, from the medieval period to classicism,

- techniques for ensemble playing in various constellations.

Intended learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the student is expected to:

Knowledge and understanding

- demonstrate a good knowledge of specific performance, style and notation issues in the repertoire studied,
- demonstrate a good knowledge of ensemble playing in different constellations,

Competence and skills

- demonstrate a good knowledge of cooperation and techniques for ensemble playing in different constellations,
- show a satisfactory ability to take initiative and to be attentive to other ensemble members, and also to actively contribute to the final artistic result,
- demonstrate a good knowledge of historically informed performance practice,

Judgement and approach

- show satisfactory knowledge and understanding of the role and possibilities of early chamber music in different contexts,
- be able to critically analyze and improve their own playing in different ensemble constellations, together with the other members of the ensemble,
- demonstrate an increased ability to reflect upon their own artistic approach and its role in contributing to a joint final artistic result.

In the event of absence from the compulsory teaching, the examiner may decide to give the student supplementary assignments instead.
