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Objective

The course objective is for the student to attain a well-developed level of artistic and technical ability, musical leadership and musical communication within the specialization of orchestral conducting. This also includes the ability to implement independent artistic ideas within assigned time frames and to evaluate and reflect upon their work on an ongoing basis.

This course is a part of the Bachelor's Programme in Music, Conducting with a specialization in Orchestral Conducting (KKDO1).

Content

The course includes:

- conducting techniques, gestures and body language as well as rehearsal methodologies,
- musical leadership and group dynamics,
- musical interpretation and communication of musical expression,
- score analysis, score study and memorization,
- repertoire and programming,



- harmonic reduction, transposition and score playing,
- ear training and structural listening.

Intended learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the student is expected to:

Knowledge and understanding

- demonstrate a well-developed knowledge of the orchestral repertoire and an understanding of its role and possibilities in different contexts,
- demonstrate well-developed knowledge of and experience with orchestral conducting methods and processes, and advanced work in orchestral conducting,

Competence and skills

- demonstrate well-developed skills in orchestral conducting, musical leadership and rehearsal methods,
- demonstrate a well-developed ability to engage in independent memorization and score study, perform agreed-upon repertoire and communicate musical expression,
- demonstrate a good ability to dialogue with musicians on different levels,
- demonstrate an ability, by ear, to describe and reproduce melodies, harmonies and rhythms in detail, and be able to play scores for small orchestras on the piano,

Judgement and approach

- demonstrate a well-developed ability to critically analyze and assess their own artistic activity,
- demonstrate a well-developed ability to reflect critically on the artistic work of others,
- critically assess various perspectives with regard to gender equality and non-discrimination in art.

Conducting: artistic performance and interpretation test,

Ear training: practical presentation,

Score playing: practical presentation.
