Applicants must also meet the following specific entry requirements: successful completion of entrance tests LS 11.0, LS 11.1a, LS 11.2 and Music theory. Applicants will be placed in selection groups based on their audition instrument(s) and selected for admission based on their results for entrance test

Description of programme

Objective

This programme is based on an artistic foundation and aims to give students the necessary training to work nationally and internationally as classical musicians. The programme also offers extensive opportunities for artistic specialization at a high level.

Practical and theoretical basis

The theoretical and practical foundation of the course is the music history and theory of Western art music, where a range of composition techniques and theoretical paradigms form the theoretical foundation for the performance elements of the course. The theoretical foundation also encompasses a knowledge of repertoire as well as theoretical perspectives on performance practice, focusing on different styles and instrument families according to the main instrument of study.

The practical foundation consists of studies centred around the musical craft, including e.g. ear training as well as interpretation in both solo and orchestral playing.

The practical foundation is tied to the elements of the theoretical foundation that are described above. Thus, the theoretical and practical foundations for the course are mutually dependent on one another.

Content

Courses in the area of specialization, classical music (110 credits in total) include instrumental or vocal studies (individual and group), rehearsal, chamber and orchestra ensembles, reflection and seminars, repertoire studies, and in certain cases, piano or another secondary instrument. Work within the specialization also includes an independent degree project worth 15 credits.

The programme additionally includes 40 credits of coursework in music theory, music history, sustainable career strategies, entrepreneurship and digital tools.



Students also choose elective courses for 30 credits, which they may use either to deepen or broaden their individual focus.

Themed variant

A variant of this programme is also offered with the same content, but where studies centre on a defined theme and focus on a close link between theoretical and artistic perspectives. This variant of the programme is offered for the main instruments of violin, viola, cello and piano, and admission is based on performance in separate auditions. Instruction takes place at Edsberg Castle (Edsbergs slott).

Intended learning outcomes

Knowledge and understanding

On completion of the programme, the student is expected to:

- demonstrate knowledge and understanding of the classical repertoire, including knowledge of its practical and theoretical foundations, its particular problems in respect to array of genres, tradition and renewal, and its contextual conditions,
- demonstrate knowledge and experience of methods and processes as well as specialized study in the field of classical music,
- report on research in a defined area of classical music.

Competence and skills

On completion of the programme, the student is expected to:

- demonstrate an ability to describe, analyze and interpret form, technique
 and content and reflect critically on their own and others' approaches in the
 field of classical music, both in their music theory courses and in practical
 work in their main subject courses,
- demonstrate an ability to independently create, realize and express their own ideas in the field of classical music, to identify, formulate, and solve artistic, performance and technical problems, and to complete artistic assignments within specified time frames,



- demonstrate an ability to describe and discuss their professional duties and artistic interests in a range of settings, orally and in writing, or using other methods,
- demonstrate a thorough command of their instrument and of different musical styles,
- demonstrate an ability to lead and inspire people of all ages in their own musical practices, from both a teaching and an artistic perspective,
- demonstrate strong ability in communicating and cooperating with others.

Judgement and approach

On completion of the programme, the student is expected to:

- describe and engage in discussions of relevant repertoire for a range of
 professional situations, taking artistic, social and ethical considerations into
 account, and be able to analyze and perform this repertoire in practice.
- demonstrate an understanding of the role in society of art in general, and music in particular,
- demonstrate an ability to recognize when further knowledge is required and to take steps to develop their own skills,
- demonstrate an ability to observe, communicate, and incorporate both an
 equality and a gender equality perspective as well as other ethical strategies
 in their work as musicians.

Independent project

To obtain the Bachelor's Degree in Music, the student must complete an independent degree project for at least 15 credits in the field of classical music.
