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## Objective

The course is aimed at exchange students at master's level studying their second semester at KMH. The course aims to develop the student's artistic ability within the chosen orientation and deepening in the field of folk music.

## Content

The content of the course is adapted to the student's specialization and orientation and contains selected parts of the following activities:

- instrument studies with individual lessons, group seminars and joint lessons,
- ensemble playing with group lessons, supervision as well as arranging and ensemble seminars,
- music theory seminars, folk music,
- individual supervision and teaching in composition and arranging,
- lectures and group seminars on musical forms of expression and artistic research methodology.

## Intended learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the student is expected to:

#### Knowledge and understanding

• demonstrate knowledge at a very high level regarding repertoire, style and means of expression within the student's musical specialization,

#### **Competence and skills**

• demonstrate technical ability and artistic expressiveness at a very high level based on the student's own musical and artistic specialization,

#### Judgement and approach

- demonstrate the ability to develop knowledge and skills in playing/singing on the main instrument at a very high level,
- demonstrate a very good ability to reflect on concepts and processes regarding artistic development related to the student's own focus on the studies at master's level.

## **Entry requirements**

Admitted to exchange programme, second cycle, at KMH.

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## Examination

The course is assessed by artistic performance and interpretation test, practical presentation and written assignment.

In special cases, for example, illness or injury, some parts can be examined through a special assignment. Each case is assessed individually in consultation with the head teacher and therapists (if applicable).

The examiner has the possibility to decide on adapted or alternative examination for students with documented disabilities.

## Grades

Grades are given according to a criterion referenced two-point scale:

U=Fail G=Pass
